Class Project Review

LEADERSHIP DOOR COUNTY CLASS XIX

Student Interest Fair

A special event to raise awareness regarding extracurricular activities available to middle school students was held Tuesday, April 29, 2008 at Thomas J. Walker Middle School in Sturgeon Bay. This first-ever "Student Interest Fair" involved fourteen area non-profit organizations, approximately 220 students, their parents and interested community members. The event was organized and sponsored by the Leadership Door County class of 2007-2008, with the goal of connecting area students with community organizations offering programs for those aged 10-13.

Leadership Door County (LDC) class members designed the program with the belief that supporting student involvement in positive extracurricular activities may lessen the likelihood that these students will instead be drawn to risky or damaging behavior, such as use of alcohol or other drugs.

The Student Interest Fair was scheduled during school hours for students in grades 5, 6 and 7. The event began with brief introductions by each participating organization, followed by a session during which students were able to visit booths manned by organization representatives to obtain details regarding participation. Sign-up sheets provided at the booths were filled with over 250 student signatures, indicating their interest. Organization representatives were also available to answer questions and provide information to parents and community members from 6-7pm that evening in the same location.

Based upon the success of this first-ever event, LDC class members are optimistic that similar programs will be repeated in subsequent years and at other schools throughout the area. A compilation of the associated planning resources and contacts has been assembled to assist schools and organizations who are interested in hosting or participating in this type of event.
